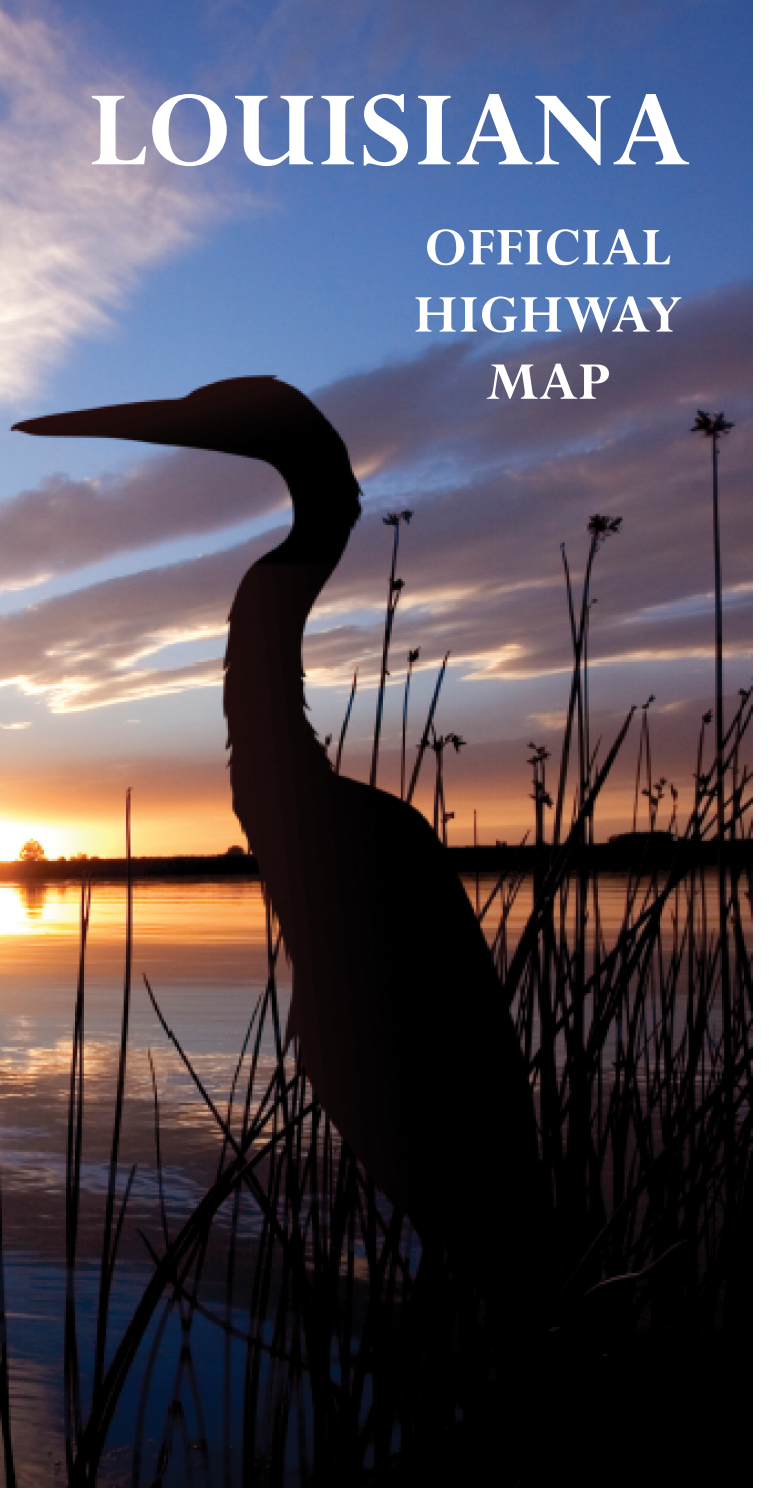

Louisiana laws to remember...

- No one shall operate any motor vehicle upon any public road or highway of this state while using a wireless telecommunications device to write, send, or read a text-based communication.
- Move your vehicle from the travel lanes to the nearest safe shoulder after a crash if the vehicle is drivable and there are no serious injuries.
- Stay alert, slow down, and move over when you see emergency vehicles on the road or roadside.
- The driver and all passengers of a moving vehicle must wear seatbelts or use proper safety restraints.
- Fines are doubled for speeding in work zones.
- All riders of a motorcycle must wear a helmet.
- Bicycles under the age of 12 must wear a helmet.
- When passing a person on a bicycle, use care and leave at least 3 feet.
- Drive with your headlights on in the rain.
- Use caution at all railroad crossings.
- Open alcoholic beverages in an operating vehicle are illegal.
- Motorists must stop for people walking in a marked crosswalk or at an intersection.
