

* Oleander will be limited to areas South of I-10 (from Texas State Line to Baton Rouge) and South of I-12 (from Baton Rouge to Slidell).

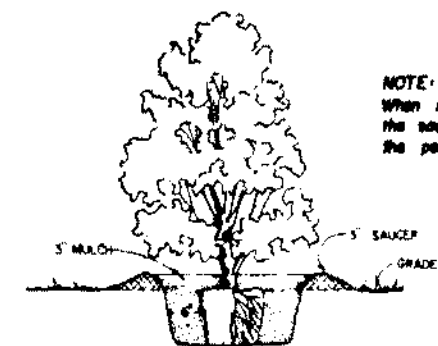

Botanical Name	Common Name & Spacing	Size
Cortaderia argentea	- Pampas grass (4' o.c.)	3'-4'
Jasminum primulinum	- Primrose jasmine (4' o.c.)	24"-30"
Ligustrum japonica	- Wax leaf ligustrum (4' o.c.)	24"-30"
Viburnum adoratissimum	- Sweet viburnum (4' o.c.)	24"-30"
* Nerium oleander	- Oleander (4' o.c.)	3'-4'
Folija sellowiana	- Pineapple guava (4' o.c.)	24"-30"
Pyracantha spp.	- Firethorn (4' o.c.)	3'-4'

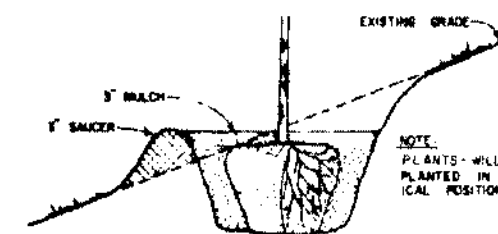
GENERAL NOTE:

1. All shrubbery to be planted a minimum of 6' from barrier. Barrier location should normally be 2' behind shoulder or travel way as directed by the Engineer.
2. Typical Shrubby locations shown are intended to serve as a guide only. Shrubby required shall be indicated on the plans or summary sheet or at locations directed by the Engineer. Payment shall be designated by the appropriate landscape pay item.
3. See Project Specifications for planting and acceptance requirements.

When mulching rows or groups of shrubs, the saucer will run continuously along the perimeter of the planting.
