

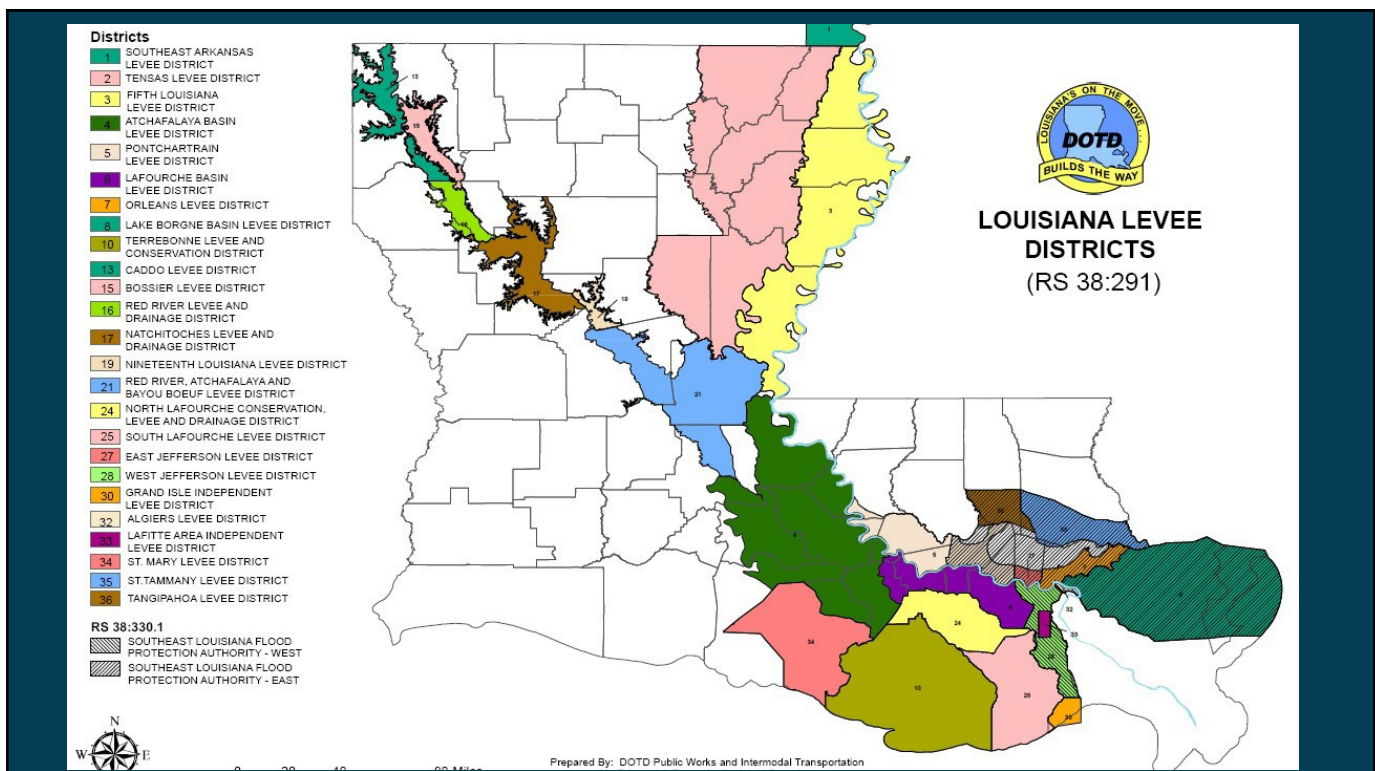


ABOUT THE TENSAS BASIN LEVEE DISTRICT

- Established by an act of the Legislature in 1884
- Oldest and geographically the largest Levee District in the State of Louisiana
- Encompasses eight parishes in Louisiana
- Governing Board consists of eleven commissioners, one in each parish, an additional at-large member, and two additional commissioners in Ouachita Parish
- Maintains two locations, two maintenance facilities, and a police department
- Revenue is derived from ad valorem (property) tax.
- Number of Levee Systems: 7
(Federal) 4 (Non-Federal)
- Miles of Levees: 250
- Miles of Floodwall: 3.5 (Static) .27 (Folding) 6.2 Total
- Miles of Waterways: 360
- Drainage Control Structures: 188
- Pump Stations: 7
- Weirs/Dams: 17
