

the mess.

After Elward shot Jenkins in the mouth, lacerating his tongue and breaking his jaw, they devised a coverup. The deputies agreed to plant drugs, and false charges stood against Jenkins and Parker for months.

McAlpin and Middleton, the oldest in the group, threatened to kill other officers if they spoke up, prosecutors said. In court Thursday, McAlpin's attorney Aafram Sellers said only Middleton threatened to kill them.

Sellers also questioned a probation officer about details submitted to the judge. When federal investigators interviewed the neighbor who called McAlpin, that person reported seeing "trashy" people at the house who were both white and Black, Sellers said. That called into question whether the episode started on the basis of race, he argued.

Federal prosecutors said the neighbor referred to people at the home as people" The information "thugs." included in the charging documents, which the officers did not dispute when they pleaded guilty, revealed some of them used racial taunts and epithets throughout the episode.

Majority-white Rankin County is just east of Jackson, home to one of

the highest percentages of Black residents of any major U.S. city. The officers shouted at Jenkins and Parker to "stay out of Rankin County and go back to Jackson or 'their side' of the Pearl River," court documents say.

Attorneys for several of

the deputies said their clients became ensnared in a culture of corruption that was encouraged by leaders in the sheriff's office.

Rankin County Sheriff Bryan Bailey revealed no details about his deputies' actions when he announced they had been

fired last June. After they pleaded guilty in August, Bailey said the officers had gone rogue and promised changes. Jenkins and Parker called for his resignation and filed a \$400 million civil lawsuit against the department.

Bailey, who was re-

elected without opposition in November, said in a statement Thursday that he is "committed to the betterment of this county" and will work "with the honest, hard-working men and women currently with this department" to make

In a statement read by his attorney, Jenkins said he "felt like a slave" and was "left to die like a

"If those who are in charge of the Rankin County Sheriff's Office can participate in these kinds of torture. God help us all," Jenkins said. "And God help Rankin County."◊

range on the average per pupil as we move into [fiscal year 2025] and beyond.

In Louisiana, public schools rely on a per-pupil funding model, which includes local and state funding for each student they enroll. In New Orleans, the district allocates money through a formula that includes a base rate and additional funds depending on the grade and education needs of individual students.

In an interview with Verite News, Gay said this extra funding may help schools better serve students with specific needs, such as the city's English learner population, which has grown slightly in the past few years.

Kenneth Ducote, executive director of the Greater New Orleans Collaborative of Charter Schools, said the extra funding will allow schools to offer higher teacher salaries and spend more money on special programs. The extra

money will also help schools with the rising costs of insurance, maintenance and utilities, Ducote said.

The expected funding increase could also help offset the loss of federal pandemic aid that served as the district's emergency relief fund after sales taxes declined during COVID-19 shutdowns, Gay said.

### Fewer students... fewer schools?

As New Orleans' student population continues to shrink, schools will see an overall funding decrease in upcoming years, said Alvin David with New Schools for New Orleans, a nonprofit focused on improving education.

An analysis published earlier this year by New Schools for New Orleans found that enrollment in the district has declined by more than 3,600 students, or seven percent, since 2019, with kindergarten enrollment dropping 20 percent since 2014.

That's in part due to a decrease in the number of children born in the city, said Dana Peterson, CEO of New Schools for New Orleans. Examining federal statistics, the group found that the number of live births in New Orleans has declined by 20 percent since 2015. The city saw only 4,045 births in 2022 the fewest since Hurricane Katrina in 2005.

Peterson said enrollment decline is not unique to Orleans Parish Louisiana. He pointed to an outmigration both the city and state are experiencing, which he said will also affect enrollment in the coming years.

This school year, New Orleans schools have an 88 percent "fill rate," meaning about 3,000 seats are vacant. Though that fill rate is an improvement previous over years, seats could still strain school budgets, making it difficult for district schools to cover maintenance and custodial costs, Gay said.

To tackle its declining student population, the district adopted a "district optimization" policy last year, acknowledging that some charter schools may have to consolidate or even close in a process sometimes called "right-sizing."

"Part of the right-sizing has to do with just having people in the right buildings," Gay said. "We don't want a school that's 250 kids to have a 180,000 square-foot facility that they can't pay for because the costs are too high."

Right-sizing will allow schools to share a building and split costs, Gay said, leaving them with more money to invest in students.

Peterson said consolidations are sustainable lower upkeep costs mean hiring more quality teachers and more resources and programming to meet the needs of young people. This also means higher fill rates across district schools, he said.

In 2022, InspireNOLA consolidated Pierre A. Capdau Charter School and McDonogh 42 Elementary Charter School. Last year, the operators of Mildred Osborne Charter School and Akili Academy in New Orleans also merged, forming a new school. Gay said these schools have seen their enrollment numbers go up since their mergers.

Despite the projections, Gay said the district could bounce back.

"I think [enrollment rates are] certainly going to increase ... we might just see a different population over time rather than a decreased population," Gay said, pointing to the school district's increase in English learners. "The better we get at welcoming those folks, getting them into the system, getting them up to speed, helping them with language and interpretation and all of that ... that will help stabilize the system a bit."◊

the second.

That gave Armstead time to improve his game.

"I could just wake up at 6, go to school, catch the bus and everything," Armstead said. "I didn't have to worry about my mom waiting outside in the car all day or anything like that. So the mental fatigue was kind of wenting off."

Stephen Bernstein helped connect Armstead with Fisk through his foundation, We Educate Brilliant Minds, based in Los Angeles.

Once Armstead arrived in Nashville, he started eating better and got busy dropping at least 30 pounds over his first two seasons.

Yet a school official learned Armstead was sending what he could home to help his family. Even that wasn't enough as his family kept moving from shelters to a hotel and back to the car. Finally last November, his mother, sister and brother finally moved into their own apartment.

Anderson has worked to help Armstead develop his basketball skills. The forward played seven games as a freshman and 12 this season, helping Fisk go 14-16.

While his family has a place to live, Armstead's mother is fighting health issues. She also cares for his brother Marcus, 18, who

didn't learn to read and write until he was 13 after being hit by a car as a child, and his sister Armani, 14, will be a high school freshman this fall.

"I have seen the worst of the worst," Armstead said.

Basketball has been his safe place. Now he is in the best physical shape of his life and majoring in kinesiology and almost halfway to a college degree he never thought would be possible. He turned 20 on March 26, an age he never envisioned reaching, let alone celebrating and planning a future.

"It showed me why ... I should keep doing what I'm doing and keep having faith in God because a few years ago I didn't think I was going to be here and I'm here," Armstead said.

gins for the proposition that denied public services to undocumented immigrants. But nearly fifty percent of Blacks also backed the measure.

Then Republican governor Pete Wilson shamelessly pandered to anti-immigrant hysteria and rode it to a reelection victory. Wilson also got nearly 20 percent of the black vote in the 1994 election. It was double what Republicans in California typically got from Blacks. Wilson almost certainly bumped up his Black vote total with his free-wheeling assault on illegal immigration. Blacks also gave substantial support to anti-bilingual ballot measures in California.

More than a decade later Black attitudes toward illegal immigrants, which almost always is seen as Latino illegal immigrants, was put to the electoral test in Arizona with another ballot initiative. Proposition two hundred mandated tough sanctions on employers for hiring illegal immigrants, and tighter border enforcement.

Exit polls showed that more than 65 percent of Blacks backed the measure. As with Proposition 187 in California a decade before, it passed by a landslide.

The vote by Blacks on the antiillegal immigration ballot measures of the past and their antipathy to illegal immigration as measured by current polls and surveys flies in the fact of the staunch support that mainstream civil rights organizations and most of the Congressional Black Caucus give to the passage of a comprehensive, liberal immigration reform law.

Yet there is a kicker in those polls and that is the issue of jobs. Blacks express deep worry that they are slipping further behind in the battle for more jobs. And that's a legitimate fear. Blacks continue to suffer the highest rates of unemployment of any group in America.

The job crisis has an especially devastating impact on young, marginal-skilled and educated Black males. In the eternal hunt for scapegoats to dump blame for the job crisis on, illegal immigration is the softest of soft targets.

That's wrong-headed, misguided, and fraught with peril. The prime cause of chronic Black unemployment is corporate downsizing, and outsourcing, the massive cuts in federal and state job and skills training funds and programs, the reluctance and flat-out refusal of many employers to hire those with criminal records, and the sneaky and open racial dispersions of the state of the sneaky and open racial dispersions of the sneaky and open racial dispe

crimination by private employers. None of that matters to Trump and those who relentlessly feed into Black fears about job loss to illegals. Trump banks on riding back into the White House by stoking a heavy dose of that fear. He banks that many Blacks who already say they like some of his positions on the issues will be among those who smooth his path to victory. Let's hope he's dead wrong on that.

seated in the chamber galleries. He was joined in the gun control protest by Reps. Pearson and Gloria Johnson. They were calling for their fellow lawmakers to take action to prevent more gun deaths. The Republican-led Tennessee State House saw the interruption of proceedings as a violation of House decorum rules and eventually voted to expel Jones and Pearson from the legislature without the benefit of full due process. But the two were quickly reappointed to their district seats and easily won landslide victories in special elections.

In the latest unprecedented move by the same Tennessee House, the entire Board of Trustees at Tennessee State University was removed after a vote by the House, and Gov. Bill Lee signed the legislation into law. The Republican supermajority's calls for a new board were based on multiple audit reports highlighting concerns about the mishandling of finances, housing, and scholarships.

The injustice comes from Tennessee State University, an 1890 land grant institution and the only HBCU in the state, being underfunded for 30 years. Students, alums, and the Black community at large should be aware of the history behind HBCUs and land-grant institutions. The original Morrill Act of 1862 established white-only land grant institutions to teach agricultural and mechanical arts. The Second Morrill Act of 1890 required that states choosing to open a second land-grant institution to serve Black students must provide equitable distribution of funds between their 1862 and 1890 land-grant institutions. Last year, a letter was sent to the governor of Tennessee from the U.S. Secretary of Education and the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture regarding the inequitable funding for HBCUs.

The letter stated, "Tennessee State University, the 1890 land-grant institution in your state, while producing extraordinary graduates that contribute greatly to the state's economy and the fabric of our nation, has not been able to advance in ways that are on par with The University of Tennessee-Knoxville, the original Morrill Act of 1862 land-grant institution in your state, in large part due to unbalanced funding." If the state funding per student for Tennessee State were equal to that of Tennessee-Knoxville, then TSU would have received an additional \$2.1 billion over 30 years. One can easily say that the holding back of critical funding to the tune of \$2.1 billion contributed greatly to the university's financial woes.

Last week, student leaders from TSU will engage faith leaders, civil rights advocates, and the community on the best ways to organize action. These same students should remember the example of Lewis when considering the unjust ways HBCUs are disenfranchised by lack of fair funding along with the attempts to dismantle HBCU leadership. It may be time for good trouble, nec-

essary trouble when mobilizing alumni and supporters to defend HBCUs.

The state of Tennessee is not alone. The governor of Mississippi received a similar letter from the Biden administration regarding the inequitable funding for Alcorn State University for \$257 million. Yet, in a recent state bill, Alcorn State was targeted for closure along with Jackson State University and Mississippi Valley State University. A total of 16 states received the letter from the Biden administration. It is a sign that HBCU students and alumni should actively lobby their state lawmakers, Democratic and Republican, to take the integral steps needed to close funding gaps for HBCUs, particularly when equitable funding is mandated by law.






The Study Area encompasses the Waggaman and Avondale areas. These four at-grade crossings were identified as Projects W10 through W13 in a prior New Orleans Rail Gateway study.



The Avondale Garden Road crossing is a 6-track crossing departing the Avondale Rail Yard and Intermodal Terminal.

There is one set of crossbucks, lights and gates at this crossing.

The trackage reduces to a 4-track crossing at George Street, which has two sets of crossbucks and lights and one set of gates.



The Willswood Lane crossing is also a 4-track crossing.

The trackage further reduces to a 3-track crossing at Live Oak Boulevard.

Like George Street, the Willswood and Live Oak crossings have two sets of crossbucks and lights and one set of gates.




These Study Goals were introduced during Local Officials and virtual Public Scoping Meetings during March and April 2022.

The study outreach also included:

- Distributing travel surveys to trucking companies to get an understanding of the trucking movements,
- Discussing the number of school bus crossings at the four crossings with Jefferson Parish School District representatives, and
- Providing study updates at multiple Civic Association meetings.

The issues of most importance we heard were crossing delays, safety concerns, emergency services access and train horn noise.



Jefferson Parish recognizes the long vehicle delay at several Jefferson Parish crossings.

In November 2022, real-time cameras were activated at seven crossing locations across the Parish, including these four crossings in Waggaman and Avondale. The cameras enable motorists to see if a train is crossing or stopped, so travel routes can be planned accordingly.

### **Alternatives Development Process**



- Process Involved Five (5) Major Steps
  - Step 1 Determine Existing and Forecast Future Roadway Traffic Volumes
  - Step 2 Determine Existing and Forecast Future Railroad Traffic Volumes and Resultant Roadway Traffic Delay
  - Step 3 Evaluate if Conditions warrant grade separating the crossings
  - Step 4 Inventory Environmental Features and Develop Grade Separation Alternatives
  - Step 5 –Evaluate effect on Environmental Features and Area Traffic and Identify Build Alternative Combinations

The process for developing the alternatives follows five basic steps:

- Step 1 Determine existing and forecast future roadway traffic volumes
- Step 2 Determine existing and forecast future railroad traffic volumes and the blocked crossing roadway traffic delay
- Step 3 Evaluate if conditions are met to grade separate the crossings
- Step 4 Identify the area environmental features and develop the alternatives, and
- Step 5 Evaluate the effect on environmental features and area traffic, and identify Build Alternative Combinations

Blocked crossings due to thru train and switching moves were calculated using existing and forecast train volume data.

Switching moves exceed thru trains at the Avondale Garden Road and George Street crossings due to their proximity to the Avondale Rail Yard.

On average, the number of hours vehicles are delayed at these crossings each day varies from approximately 21 hours at Live Oak Boulevard (in 2021) to approximately 80 hours at Avondale Garden Road (in 2048).

The morning and afternoon peak hour traffic was determined, as part of the Step 1 Traffic Analyses, to be from 6:45 AM to 7:45 AM and 4:30 PM to 5:30 PM, respectively.

These figures illustrate the maximum length that traffic could back up at Avondale Garden Road in the morning (in Blue) and in the afternoon (in Red).

These queues were calculated based on projected traffic volumes. It was noted during field observations that drivers at times altered their travel route upon seeing a train blocking the crossing. Therefore, actual queues in the field may appear less than those shown on this slide due to drivers altering their behavior to avoid congestion.

George Street Rail Crossing AM (Blue) and PM (Red) Peak Hour Vehicle Queue Lengths











- Whenever a new grade separation is constructed, consideration should be given to the possibility of closing one or more adjacent crossings provided:
  - Acceptable alternate access across the rail line exists within one (1) mile measured along the track
  - The median trip length normally made over the crossing would not increase by more than 2.5 miles
- Avondale Garden Road and George Street crossings both satisfy this Guidance

Federal Highway Administration guidance identifies warrant conditions to be considered in evaluating whether an at-grade crossing is a candidate for grade separation.

Only two of FHWAs warrant conditions are applicable to the Waggaman and Avondale crossings, the average number of trains per day and the daily vehicle delay due to blocked crossings.

Only the Avondale Garden Road, George Street and Willswood Lane crossings exceed these warrant conditions. The Live Oak Boulevard crossing does not exhibit the number of train crossings or resultant vehicle delay required to consider grade separation.

The Guidance also indicates that consideration should be given to closing adjacent crossings, given certain criteria, when a grade separation is contemplated. The Avondale Garden Road and George Street crossings satisfy the listed distance criteria. The Willswood Lane crossing does not.



Numerous environmental features are scattered throughout the Waggaman/Avondale area.

The dominant environmental features within the Study Area are residential and commercial development, wetlands, floodplains, and the Greater New Orleans, Jefferson Parish & River Birch landfills south of the railroad tracks.

# **Step 4 – Avondale Garden Road (AGR) Alternative**






- New grade separated roadway connecting US 90 and River Road
- Closes the existing George Street and AGR at-grade crossings
- Adds access from AGR to the Realigned Alternative
- Relocates access to the Intermodal Yard via a new Access Road
- Expands Jefferson Parish's Bicycle/Pedestrian Access

### The Avondale Garden Road Alternative would:

- Construct a new grade separated roadway between the AGR residential properties and the Truck Stop and Container Yard, connecting US 90 and River Road,
- Close both the existing George Street and AGR at-grade crossings,
- Add a new, direct connection from AGR to the Realigned Alternative and relocate access to the Intermodal Yard via a new Access Road, and
- Expand Jefferson Parish's Bicycle/Pedestrian Access.

# **Step 4 – Avondale Garden Road (AGR) Alternative**





- Cul-de-sac's AGR
- Relocates the existing intersection to a new Signalized intersection
- Retains dedicated left- and right-turn, and U-turn movements
- Estimated Cost \$62.0M

Avoids wetlands | Impacts floodplains | Two commercial relocations | Eliminates train horn noise

### The Avondale Garden Road Alternative would also:

- Cul-de-sac AGR and remove the existing intersection with US 90,
- Relocate the existing intersection to the new signalized intersection, and
- Retain the existing dedicated left- and right-turn and U-turn movements at the new intersection location.

## The estimated cost is \$62.0M

This alternative would avoid wetlands but would impact floodplains. It would result in two commercial relocations – Concrete Busters and MTC Trucking. Closing the George Street and AGR crossings would eliminate the required train horn auditory warnings.



The Avondale Garden Road Alternative would look similar to this.

# **Step 4 – Willswood Lane Realignment**





- Realigns and grade separates existing Willswood Lane
- Closes the existing Willswood Lane atgrade crossing
- Maintains access to residential properties
- Expands Jefferson Parish's Bicycle/Pedestrian Access
- Estimated Cost \$57.2M

Avoids wetlands | Minimizes floodplains | Avoids residential/commercial relocations | Eliminates train horn noise

## The Willswood Lane Realignment would:


- Realign and grade separate the existing Willswood Lane to the east,
- Close the existing Willswood Lane at-grade crossing,
- Maintain access to existing residential properties via the existing roadway, and
- Expand Jefferson Parish's Bicycle/Pedestrian Access.

### The estimated cost is \$57.2M

This alternative would avoid wetlands and minimize floodplain impacts. It would also not result in any residential or commercial relocations and would also eliminate the required Willswood Lane train horn auditory warning.



The Willswood Lane Realignment would look similar to this.



### The Willswood Lane Alternate would:

- Construct a new grade separated roadway west of Willswood Lane connecting Live Oak Boulevard and River Road,
- Close the existing Willswood Lane at-grade crossing, and
- Expand Jefferson Parish's Bicycle/Pedestrian Access.

# Step 4 – Willswood Lane Alternate





- New grade separated roadway connecting Live Oak Boulevard and River Road
- Closes the existing Willswood Lane atgrade crossing
- Expands Jefferson Parish's Bicycle/Pedestrian Access
- Increases the trip length by no more than 1.75 miles
- Estimated Cost \$48.1M

Bridges wetlands | Impacts floodplains | Avoids residential/commercial relocations | Eliminates train horn noise

It would increase the trip length for Willswood Lane residents by no more than 1.75 miles, depending the travel destination.

The estimated cost is \$48.1M

This alternative would bridge wetlands but would impact floodplains. It would not result in any residential or commercial relocations. Closing the Willwood Lane crossing would eliminate the required train horn auditory warning.



The Willswood Lane Alternate would look similar to this.

These three alternatives, in various combinations, resulted in five Build Alternatives.

- Build Alternative 1 is the Avondale Garden Road (AGR) Alternative and closes both the existing AGR and George Street crossings
- Build Alternative 2 is the Willswood Lane Realignment and closes the existing Willswood Lane crossing
- Build Alternative 3 is the Willswood Lane Alternate, and also closes the existing Willswood Lane crossing
- Build Alternative 4 combines the Avondale Garden Road (AGR) Alternative (Build Alternative 1) and the Willswood Lane Realignment (Build Alternative 2), closing the existing Willswood Lane, George Street, and AGR crossings
- Build Alternative 5, combines the Avondale Garden Road (AGR) Alternative (Build Alternative 1) and the Willswood Lane Alternate (Build Alternative 3), also closing the existing Willswood Lane, George Street, and AGR crossings


These five Build Alternatives can be viewed in more detail along with rendering of the alternatives in the Exhibits Area.

The potential impacts and estimated costs of the five Build Alternatives are summarized in this table.

The No Build Alternative would not result in any impacts to wetlands or floodplains or require any relocations, and would have zero cost, but would not correct any of the stated goals.

# **Step 5 – Area Traffic Analyses**






- Existing and new intersections were evaluated to determine potential impacts to surrounding roadway network
- None of the five Build Alternatives would result in any significant intersection delays or travel impacts to area roadways

Area intersections were evaluated to determine any impacts of the Build Alternatives on the surrounding roadway network.

The red dashed circles indicate existing intersections where analyses were conducted for the forecast future No Build and all five Build Alternatives.

The blue dashed circles indicate the new intersections that were evaluated for the Build Alternatives. These intersections differ depending on the Build Alternative being evaluated.

None of the five Build Alternatives would result in any significant intersection delays or travel impacts to area roadways.



This PEL study is nearing completion. The study will advance to the NEPA study phase later this year. The NEPA phase will further refine the alternatives with a focus on the environmental impacts. The study and NEPA documentation will take at least a year to complete.







